In this issue there is an article about the first case report of Fasciola Hepaticus in Iraq in the North city of Sulaimayniah ,this will be a stimulus for the health authorities and research workers to study this in details .

Another article from Basrah address the pathogencity of what was considered anon pathogenic organism Blastocysts hominis and the good response to trimethoprim – sulpha.

There are papers on familial Mediterranean fever and a paper on Iraq alcoholic liver disease became a problem second only to the viral etiology. A paper on coeliac disease in our thin Iraqi patients and the problem of liver disease in pregnancy. Amebic liver absecces are addressed by a paper from the north of Iraq. This artical point to the importance of liver abscesses in Iraq and the need to use the seriological testing and also study the response of Amoeba to the usual treatments in Iraq. There is a need to expand this study all over Iraq as we have not seen definit evidence of Amoebiasis in the cases mentioned in this article. There are unconfirmed reports of Ameoba resistent to metronidazole treatment in Iraq which need to be studied.

The problems associated with duodenal diverticula is addressed in one of the papers.

Thanks to the colleagues from the AGA who sent medical journals, and DDW activities and CDS which we distributed to all our medical colleges and we hope other societies will do the same.
